Rugby Swimming Club's Artistic Swimmers journeyed down to the London Aquatics Centre for the Swim England Artistic Swimming Combo Cup. After 2 years away due to Covid restrictions it was so exciting to be back in full action.

The Combo Cup is a very special event in the calendar because it provides an opportunity for some of these swimmers to compete at a national event for the first time.

The first Rugby team to swim were Rugby's 13-15 group in Division 2 with their retro 80's dance theme of differing tempos and challenging figure formations. They scored 61.4667 and came away with the gold medal, a full 2 points ahead of the silver medallists from The City of Bristol.

The second Rugby team swimming were 13-15 in Division 1 known as Team Aladdin. This was a strong and confident performance where a bronze medal was narrowly missed by only 0.1334 of a point. Even though they missed a medal they should be proud of coming so close in such a competitive category.

The next Rugby Team to swim were the 12 and under Division 1 with their American music theme. This was the first time at the Combo cup for most of the team members and they fully seized the opportunity to demonstrate their skills and enjoy the experience. Their energetic performance generated a healthy score for a novice team.

Two Rugby Teams competed in 15-18 Division 2. Team 1 scored a strong 58.8667putting in a great performance which was fearless and lively. Team 2 with their own retro 80's theme won clear gold with a score of 66.6000, a lead of 1.8667 against the silver medallists from City of Salford. Their routine was unique, great fun, thrilling and dramatic. The spectators went wild!

The Combo Cup is awarded to the team with the most points at the end of the day. Sadly, Rugby were 2 points off the winning total this year, but they were gracious in handing their previously won cup over to The City of Salford team which was well deserved.
